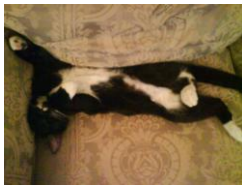


Adoptions

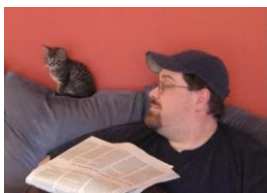
