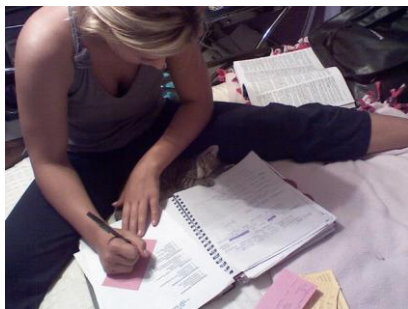

WOW! WE EXCEED 100 ADOPTIONS IN LESS THAN 10 MONTHS

The Board of Directors of Chesapeake Cats & Dogs would like to thank all the adopting families, our volunteers and the community that have supported us to make this rescue group very successful! As of the first week of October, we have rescued, rehabilitated and placed over 100 cats and dogs. There have been 89 cat adoptions and 13 dog adoptions. Our dog program will grow as we continue to formulate dog placement policies and obtain more foster homes for dogs. Thanks to everyone who has helped us in anyway help these wonderful animals.

A CCAD board member received a call that evening to help with the kittens that needed to be bottle fed. Two board members went to the center to pick up some KMR (kitten replacement milk) and a bottle and brought them over to the Helfenbein's. They took care of the kittens for 4 days until Alyssa needed to move to a home close to Towson State University. The kittens then went into our foster care. When they were old

enough for adoption, all 5 kittens were adopted the first week they came into the center. Alyssa came back and adopted her little Sally who she renamed Chaz. Judith from Annapolis adopted 2 (seen to the right) and Jeff's family from Columbia adopted 2. The foster mom, Mary, named all 5 kittens after Charlie Brown characters. These kittens were very fortunate to be rescued from a feral situation and enter homes where they will be loved and well cared for. Thank you Alyssa and family.



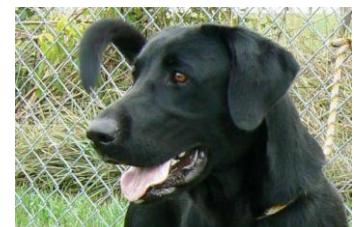
